Possible New Direction for Alternative School:
Our student numbers in Alternative School (short term and long term) have been somewhat low. (YEA!) Therefore, this is an opportunity to redirect our efforts to be more proactive with students who have special needs. We are VERY fortunate to have Johnny Tekulve and Charlie Montgomery who run this program. They are talented educators who have a heart for students. At Parent Advisory, Teacher Advisory and Administrators' Meetings, we discussed the idea of having Mr. Tekulve and Mr. Montgomery mentor students who need encouragement or special assistance. We will start slow to develop this capacity. Students will be referred through principals and counselors.
